

Processional Hymn

Come, ye faithful, raise the strain

The presider reads an opening sentence of scripture appointed for the season.

Confession of Sin

The presider reads the words of the exhortation on page 41 to the people.

Presider and People together, all kneeling

Almighty and most merciful Father, we have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep, we have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts, we have offended against thy holy laws, we have left undone those things which we ought to have done, and we have done those things which we ought not to have done. But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, spare thou those who confess their faults, restore thou those who are penitent, according to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord; and grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

The lay presider says

The Almighty and merciful Lord grant *us* absolution and remission of all *our* sins, true repentance, amendment of life, and the grace and consolation of his Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

THE INVITATORY AND PSALTER

All stand

Presider:O Lord Open thou our lips.People:And our mouths shall show forth thy praise

Officiant and People

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost: * as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Venite

Here first the presider reads a seasonal antiphon (p. 43 or 44)

Then the presider and the people pray together:

O come, let us sing unto the Lord; * let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation. Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving * and show ourselves glad in him with psalms. For the Lord is a great God, * and a great King above all gods. In his hand are the corners of the earth, * Psalm 95:1-7

and the strength of the hills is his also. The sea is his, and he made it, * and his hands prepared the dry land. O come, let us worship and fall down, * and kneel before the Lord our Maker. For he is the Lord our God, * and we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand. O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; * let the whole earth stand in awe of him. For he cometh, for he cometh to judge the earth, * and with righteousness to judge the world and the peoples with his truth.

Here the presider repeats the seasonal antiphon (p. 43 or 44)

The First Lesson

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: *Thanks be to God*.

The Song of Mary Magnificat

He hath put down the mighty from their seat, * and hath exalted the humble and meek. He hath filled the hungry with good things, 8 and the rich he hath sent empty away. He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel, *as he promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed for ever. Prayed together Glory be to God on high, and on earth peace, good will towards men. We praise thee, we bless thee, we worship thee, we glorify thee, we give thanks to thee for thy great glory, O Lord God, heavenly King, God the Father Almighty. O Lord, the only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ; O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us. Thou that takest away the sins of the world, receive our prayer. Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us. For thou only art holy, thou only art the Lord, thou only, O Christ, with the Holy Ghost. art most high in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Apostle's Creed Presider and People together, all standing

I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth; And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.
