The Episcopal Church

Our denomination is part of the global Anglican Communion, and is part of a tradition of reformed Catholicism. We follow the teachings of Jesus Christ, and trace our origins back Christ, his disciples, and the early church through Apostolic Succession. We affirm that God is only known in the three persons of the Trinity — the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost as expressed in the Apostle's, Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds. As part of our Anglican heritage we believe in the centrality of Holy Scripture, tradition, and reason in our worship and life of faith. The Holy Eucharist is the heart of our faith communities.

Who We Are

Saint Gabriel's Episcopal Parish welcomes all people and meets everyone where they are on their spiritual journeys with Christ. We try our best to be a community of faith celebrating and sharing Christ's love with each-other, our communities, and the world. There are many ministries and programs here which help all better know Christ. The Parish is open and affirming, and welcomes all from within the LGBTQ+ community and beyond to participate fully.

The Liturgy & Books

Worship in the Episcopal Church is drawn from both contemporary and ancient sources, and is aided by books and a bulletin. *The Book of Common Prayer* is the red book, the Hymnal is the blue one. The Mass settings (Kyrie, Sanctus, Lord's Prayer, & Agnus Dei) are found on the card hanging in the pew.

Nursery & Church School

Free nursery care is available during the Liturgy for children under age four. Youth Formation (Church School) and is available for all children and youth ages 4 and up from Sept - June starting at 9:30AM. An Usher can help you and your family locate both spaces.

Priest: Do you present this icon to this Parish?

Iconographer: I do.

Mary Wilson officially hands the icon over to the Rector who accepts it on behalf of the whole Parish.

Priest: Our help is in the Name of the Lord. People: Who has made heaven and earth.

Priest: The Lord be with you. People: *And also with you.*

Priest: Let us pray. Almighty and everlasting God, who has not forbidden us to carve or paint figures and images of thy Saints, that as often as we look upon their resemblances with our eyes, we may recall their holy examples, and so be stirred up to follow their pattern and holiness: we beseech you to bless and hallow this icon, fashioned in honor and in memory of the Arch Angel Saint Gabriel and the most blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. Grant that whosoever before this image shall endeavor worthily to venerate and honor the same most blessed Virgin, may at her intercession obtain grace in this present life, and everlasting glory in that which is to come. Through the same Christ our Lord.

O Emmanuel, God who is with us, we know that you desire your beloved to come into eternal salvation and enter not into eternal death.
